Ashley       He said "dug-out," Penelope...where the benches are.

Coach        Way to go, team. I'm so proud of your performance out there today on the field. You were awesome. Hank, you were a big hitter at the plate. That homer in the fifth really set us up for the win.

- Hank First, we have to face the Phillies and now Zach Turner?
- Coach Well, kids, I think we might be just the thing that Zach needs. Remember, the Bible says "If you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can move a mountain!" - Hank OK, you all heard the coach. Let's take the field. Zach, why don't you take the mound. Matt, you catch. Chris you cover first. I'll take short and Ashley and Leigh, you take second and third. Penelope, you can hit first.
- Zach Hey, no way. I always play shortstop.
- Hank Come on, Zach...just toss a few then we'll switch things up.

- Zach            *(Disgusted.)* Fine. *(Zach sees a bug on the ground and puts it on Penelope's bat.)* Here take this bat.

- Ashley          How terrible.
- Miriam          When my baby brother was born, my mother tried to hide him at first. But as he grew, my mother knew that she must do something to save him. She put her baby boy in a basket and floated him down the Nile River. I hid in the bushes and watched over him. The Pharaoh's daughter saw my baby brother and rescued him. I went right up to her and asked if I could help her find a woman to care for the baby.

- Penelope     Miriam, you were so brave.
- Miriam       She agreed so I brought my mother to her and she let my mom care for her own son. That baby was my brother, Moses. I had faith that God was with me and my baby brother.
- Manti         *(Manti looks at his watch.)* Time to remember, “Faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.”
- Hopper        God will protect you and care for you when you face scary things. Have faith!

- Miriam        When tough times come have faith in God. He will help you. Gotta go! I’m babysitting my cousin this afternoon. See you on the flipside.

**Split:54** *(Giant footstep sounds begin as Miriam exits through the grass.)*

- Hank          What’s next, Hopper?
- Matt          Yeah, what’s next?
- Hopper        You must believe.
- Zach          Hey wait a minute. How can anyone really believe when everything around them is totally crashing?
- Hopper        Zach, I have a very special friend that you should meet. He’s not a kid, but he is known for not being very tall. *(Looking around)* Zacchaeus, where are you?
- Zacchaeus    I’m up here! *(Zacchaeus is on a ladder behind the grass as if climbing a blade of grass.)*
- Hopper        Zacchaeus, come down. **Split:55** *(Giant footstep sounds begin as Zacchaeus climbs down.)* I have someone special I would like you to meet, a human that shares your name. Zacchaeus meet Zach.
- Zacchaeus    Hi, Zach. I’m totally lovin’ the name. Zach...yeah, I’m feelin’ it.
- Zach          How could YOU be a *giant*?

- Zacchaeus I wasn't at first, Zachman. I was the chief tax collector for my city.
- Chris My dad does NOT like tax collectors.
- Zacchaeus The sad thing is that I was not a good man. I stole money from the poor and cheated people all the time. But one day, I heard about this man named Jesus. I thought, "I would like to know more about this Man." SO I climbed a sycamore tree to see him.
- Penelope Great view from up top. *(She cups her eyes pretending to look.)*
- Zacchaeus Suddenly, Jesus said, "Zacchaeus, come down. I must stay at your house today." So down I came and guess what? He really did go home with me. That day changed me forever. Inviting Jesus into my house, and really into my life, made me feel so cool inside. I started giving money to the poor and if I had cheated anyone, I gave them four times the money I had taken. Jesus saved me that day and I've never been the same since.
- Zach I wish I could have Jesus visit me. That sounds awesome! I don't want to be afraid anymore. I want Jesus in my house. Like you, Zacchaeus!
- Hopper I think you must attack this fear situation...head on.
- Manti Definitely, Hopper. It's *time* this human experienced a real Zach attack!

**Scene 8**

- Hopper You see, Zach, God gave Jesus, His Son. He paid the price for us so we can be saved.
- Manti *(Manti looks at the clock around his neck.)* It's scripture *time*. "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost."
- Zach But what if everything is going wrong in your life. Can Jesus help then?
- Hopper Yes, Zach. He wants to help you...to give you courage...and "faith" to make it through the tough times. He wants to be your friend.

Zacchaeus You need to do what I did, Zach. Invite him home to live in your heart. Just say, "Jesus, I am so sorry for what I've done. Forgive me." Then, tell Him you believe in Him and claim Him as your Lord.

Hank Yeah, Zach. asking Jesus to live in my heart was the best thing I ever did.

Zach Do you mean Jesus is here right now? He can hear me? I can be a part of His team?

Zacchaeus Sure thing, kid. Go for it.

Manti *(Manti looks at his watch.)* This is your moment in *time*. "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you." I believe it's time to pray!

Ashley No prob, Zach. Now you are really a part of the team. You are a Giant.

Coach *(Yelling)* Hank, Chris, Ashley! Giants, where are you?

Chris Hey you guys, Coach Summers is coming!

Manti It's *time* to go!

Hopper We better hop on out of here. Just remember you are giants...giants of the faith because you have Jesus!

*(Coach Summers enters. The kids head through the fence crossing to meet Coach Summers making sure they bring their ball the fence closes slowly during the dialogue.)*

And we found out that, yeah, the Phillies might be giants but, we are giants, too—giants as long as we have Jesus. No matter what the score, we win with Him.
- Matt            Yeah Coach, Zach here has turned out to be a real player. We're really glad to have him on the team.
- Leigh           The opening is around here somewhere, Coach Summers.
- Penelope       Where did it go?
- Hank            It's gone!
- Coach           (*Looks over the fence.*) Wow! That's an interesting story. I'm not sure what you're talking about. But all I know is that behind that fence is Miss Lily and Miss Birdie's back yard. They are two sweet ladies that go to my church. Hey, I'm feeling ice cream. Come on Giants. It's on me.
- Kids            Yea! All right! (*ad lib cheers*)
- (The kids all run off but Zach returns.)*
- Zach            So as you can see, my life was changed forever. I have Jesus and now I can face anything. I hope you'll join me in the *Land of the Giants*!
