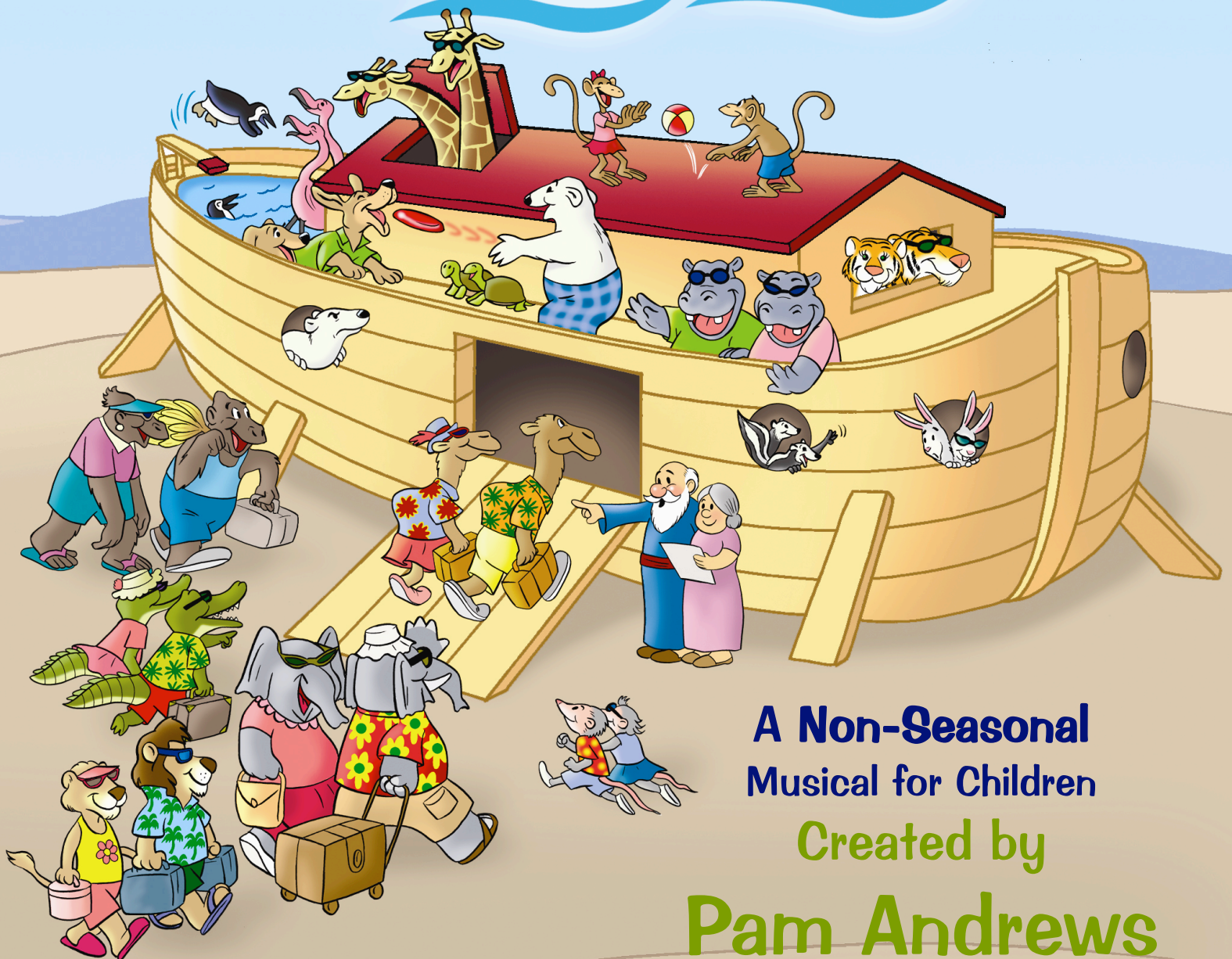

CD: 8

Hope: How exciting to hear about this wonderful man of the sea, Captain Noah. Dr. Rockstone, tell us more. What kind of man was Noah?

Rockstone: That's a great question. Noah was truly a man of God. It is said that Noah found favor in the eyes of the Lord.

Goodie: Noah had a wonderful family. He had a wife and three sons: Shem, Ham, and Japheth.

Rockstone: The world during Noah's time was not good. The people did not follow God.

Goodie: So God decided to send a great flood to remove all the evil. The amazing thing is— that in this land—it had never rained before.

Hope: Never rained?

Rockstone: Never.

Noah: That's Ok, boys. I know you're doing your best. We want the Promise Cruise to be just how God planned it. I'm heading over to gather some more pitch for the hull. You know, we want to keep our passengers nice and dry. (Noah exits.)

Japheth: Shem, I told you that you measured wrong. Be more careful next time.

Townsperson: Uh, excuse me...whatever do you think you are doing?

Shem: We are building an ark, ma'am...we're building the first boat of our Promise Cruise Line.

Ham: Yep, doesn't it look great?

Mr. Dove: Sure thing, Captain!
